

FINAL COMMUNIQUÉ by UGANDA

ROUNDTABLE ON REMUNERATION OF POSTAL SERVICES FOR THE AFRICA REGION

MOUNT MERU HOTEL, ARUSHA, TANZANIA FROM 21ST TO 23RD DECEMBER, 2015

Within the framework of the Istanbul World Postal Strategy, it is the intention of the UPU system to improve the remuneration between postal operators with the key objective of supporting countries in the Terminal Dues transition. It is within this context that the round table on remuneration of postal services for the Africa region was held at Mount Meru Hotel, Arusha, Tanzania from 21st to 23rd January, 2020. The broad aim of the round table was to build consensus that would enable the Africa Region to come up with agreeable proposals on remuneration to the upcoming UPU Congress.
